

CRYOSURGERY

You were treated with **liquid nitrogen** which produces a cold induced injury by extremely rapid freezing of the skin. The area surrounding tissues may swell within an hour and may be accompanied by throbbing pain. A **blister** or **blood blister** may develop. **For a few days the treated area may ooze.** Within one week, the swelling will diminish and the skin will appear pink. **The color will eventually return to normal.** Cryosurgery causes less scar formation and less postoperative infection than other methods of treatment.

*If a blister forms, pierce small holes in the base of the blister with a needle you sterilize with alcohol. This process may need to be repeated several times per day. If you pierce a blister be sure to apply POLYSPORIN or BACITRACIN ointment over the area. A band aid cover is optional.

WE DO NOT RECOMMEND NEOSPORIN OINTMENT.

Weeping or crusting may appear for several days. Keep the area clean with soap and water. You may shower, swim, apply sunscreen or make up the day after treatment
